




2017 - 2018

ROUX'S MISSION


Roux Library's mission is to educate students in developing lifelong, critical, information-seeking skills by identifying and making information resources available to the college community, and by providing engaged instruction for access and use of information resources.

FACULTY RESEARCH MARATHON

- First held in summer 2015
- Dr. Dapko suggested the idea to the Library Director
- First year featured more sessions, less work time
- The event has evolved over time in response to feedback

- 2nd & 3rd floors of the Roux Library
- IRB session
- Dedicated time for research




