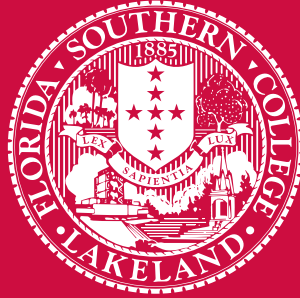




FACULTY ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2013 - 2014

## CHEMISTRY AND COMMUNICATION DEPARTMENTS COLLABORATE

Collaborative projects are common on campus, but it's unusual for a project to bring together disciplines as different as chemistry and communications. Yet a grant from the Alcoa Foundation obtained by Visiting Assistant Professor of Chemistry Jarrod Eubank resulted in a successful collaboration that produced an educational video about an exciting research field in chemistry.

Eubank and Assistant Professor of Communication Will Allen, assisted by two students from each department, produced the video, "Energy and Biomedical Nanostructures," which is posted on the website of the Materials Research Society. It describes research being conducted by Eubank in the field of metal-organic frameworks, substances with a wide range of applications in medicine, the automotive industry, and environmental science, among other fields.

Allen and his students, Katherine Becker and Olivia DeArment, worked with Eubank and his students, Grace Beggs and Tyler Logan, to script, shoot, and edit the video, which is about five minutes in length. It required the communications students to grasp the chemical principles involved, while the chemistry students had to think about how to communicate the sophisticated research in simple terms.

"I saw it as art and science coming together. They are building things, and so were we," Allen says.

Eubank used the grant funds to pay the students stipends, to cover the costs of producing the video, and to obtain modeling kits—used in the video—that he will now be able to use as a teaching tool.

"It was a perfect interdisciplinary opportunity," Eubank says. "You don't often see chemistry collaborating with the arts, but why wouldn't you? The whole point of science is to disseminate the results."

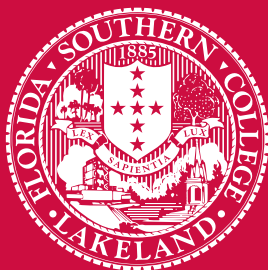
