

PROFESSOR GAUTHIER AWARDED PRESTIGIOUS FULBRIGHT SCHOLAR GRANT

Professor of Chemistry Carmen V. Gauthier achieved a rare mark of academic distinction in February when she was awarded a prestigious Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program grant.

Dr. Gauthier, who holds the Jessie Ball duPont Fund Chair in the Natural Sciences at FSC, was notified by the U.S. Department of State that she was named a 2016-2017 Fulbright Scholar, joining a highly select group of academics. Only about 500 Core Fulbright U.S. Scholar grants, such as she received, are awarded annually.

Dr. Gauthier joined the faculty at FSC in 1999 and was named to the Jessie Ball duPont Fund Chair in 2010. Her research projects at FSC, in which her students assist, focus on constructing compounds known as metal-organic materials, which have a wide range of applications in biological and materials sciences, from drug delivery systems to building construction.

She will use the Fulbright grant to teach and conduct research at her alma mater, the Catholic University of Peru in Lima, from August to December, with a particular emphasis on solving problems faced by Peru, such as air quality and preservation of historic structures threatened by increased rainfall due to the weather phenomenon of El Niño.

"I was thrilled when I learned I had been accepted, and I am ecstatic about going back to my alma mater," said Dr. Gauthier. "It feels very special, because I am an immigrant. To be an ambassador and to build relationships between Peru and America is incredible."

DR. KIRA OMELCHENKO RECOVERS AN ORIGINAL AMERICAN OPERA'S OVERTURE

Through her doctoral studies at the University of Iowa, Assistant Professor of Music Kira Omelchenko became interested in research on the first American composer to write an opera on an American theme. She discovered the composer George Frederick Bristow (1825–1898), one-time concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, who wrote an opera based on Washington Irving's short story "Rip Van Winkle."

As a result of musical scholarship and persistence, Dr. Omelchenko produced a critical edition of the opera's overture that has now been recorded by a professional ensemble.

A critical edition of a musical manuscript attempts to recover the artist's original score, which may have become altered over the years, adding appropriate footnotes and documentation. Dr. Omelchenko found Bristow's handwritten score of *Rip Van Winkle*, which premiered in 1855, in the archives of the New York Public Library.

"Bristow changed the story of "Rip Van Winkle" to make it about the American Revolution, and there's a romantic subplot about his daughter. It's a rather light, comic opera. Musically it evokes English parlor songs and ballads," she said.

After her dissertation was finished, Dr. Omelchenko was contacted by Rebecca Miller, conductor of the Royal Northern Sinfonia, a professional chamber orchestra in England. She was interested in Bristow's music and wanted to record the Overture to *Rip Van Winkle* using Dr. Omelchenko's critical edition. The 8-minute overture was released in 2015 as part of the Royal Northern Sinfonia's CD, *George Frederick Bristow: Symphony No. 2 ("Jullien")/Overtures.*

"I'm very pleased with it," Dr. Omelchenko said. "It's a magical experience to hear other musicians' interpretations of what you're trying to represent. I hope Bristow would be pleased."





GRAPHITE DREAMS: WILL ALLEN'S DOCUMENTARY ABOUT THE PENCIL CAPTURES THE IMAGINATION

Consider the humble pencil. Assistant Professor of Communication Will Allen has. His new documentary, *No. 2: Story of the Pencil*, examines the history of the pencil and the impact it has had on creativity, work, and human progress.

In a charming and emotional story, *No. 2: Story of the Pencil* develops the historical significance of this ordinary tool. The pencil continues to lose dominance in a media-saturated world, but Allen asks, if we move away from using this analog piece of technology, what is society losing? How significant is the pencil to ingenuity?

Allen has shown the one-hour film at a dozen film festivals, where it has been well received. It won Best Professional Documentary at the 2016 George Lindsey Film Festival at the University of North Alabama at Florence and took third place in the documentary division of the Knoxville (Tenn.) Film Festival in September.

"It's been an awesome ride," Allen says.

Now audiences around the world will get to see this amusing and informative film through iTunes and other digital platforms. Allen has arranged for *No. 2: Story of the Pencil* to be rented or purchased on iTunes and subsequently on Google Play. Other digital platforms, such as Netflix, Hulu, Xfinity VOD, and Miscrosoft, may follow suit, and Allen is also looking into distributing the film through educational outlets, including PBS.

Allen says that in a world of complex technology, his film has struck a nerve with the millennial generation, including his students.

"They love it," he says. "There is kind of a back-to-analog movement. Maybe these kids want a break from the digital world. But when I show it to my classes, it's fun to see them respond."
