LEARNING AND GROWING: DR. LORI RAKES RESEARCHES EDUCATOR DEVELOPMENT

After working as an elementary-school teacher for more than 20 years, Dr. Lori Rakes knows how difficult it can be for teachers to remain engaged and find new ways to grow. As assistant professor of education at FSC, she is devoting herself to research on how one particular trend in elementary education in America may be helping or hindering teachers' careers.

The traditional model in elementary education uses "self-contained" classrooms, in which one teacher teaches all subjects. Dr. Rakes and a research partner from George Mason University in Virginia have been investigating the effects of "departmentalization," in which different subjects are taught by different teachers, as in middle and high school. It is an ambitious, long-term study, surveying the stakeholders in schools that have adopted this model: administrators who make the decisions, teachers who must work in such systems, and "pre-service" teachers (either college students majoring in education or teachers at the beginning of their careers).

There are arguments for and against departmentalization, and Dr. Rakes' research found that teachers are divided in their opinions.

"Some teachers saw it as a way to alleviate the pressure of planning to teach six subjects a day. Others said that by sending students to different teachers, they lose the connections between the subjects. It can be hard for young children to make those connections on their own," she says.

The study is part of Dr. Rakes' concern for educator development, with special attention to the students she is preparing to become teachers.

"We know that teachers who continue to grow professionally tend to be happier than those who don't, are more effective in the classroom, and stay in the profession longer than those who do not," she says.

DR. ERICA BERNHEIM CELEBRATES THE ART OF LANGUAGE

Poetry may be the most intimate of all the arts. Poetry readings usually attract small audiences, the better to catch the twists and shades of meaning in the words. Dr. Erica Bernheim, associate professor of English, happily accepts the terms of her art. She often gives readings of her work in local venues, such as libraries and coffee shops.

Her first book of poetry, *The Mimic Sea*, was published in 2012 by 42 Mile Press, and she is working on two more manuscripts. Her work is drawing attention, and a number of her poems have been published recently in major literary journals. Then in April, she won the inaugural Swati Prize in Poetry from *Arcturus*, an online magazine from the *Chicago Review of Books*.

Dr. Bernheim has worked in various styles, including one described as “nearly Baroque,” which embraces extravagant use of language, but during a recent sabbatical, she turned to a more narrative style that is focused on subject rather than language. She also became interested in writing about Florida.

One of her Swati Prize-winning poems, *Sinkholes of Florida*, suggests that living in the Sunshine State can involve danger and denial:

*... We are so good at covering and
forgetting, at thinking about anything
other than the monsters below. I sit each
night down in my cottage, waiting for the
earth to open, for my nemesis, the love-
child of a glassblower and an octopus
to suction whatever may be left to us
downward to darkness, on extended wings.*

“I always wanted to be a prose writer,” Dr. Bernheim says. “I think of my recent poems as a story in fragments, and I’m piecing it together.”

THEATRE PROFESSOR JIM BECK DESIGNS AWARD-WINNING SETS

For the second time in three years, Associate Professor of Theatre Arts James F. Beck has won a regional award for his set design in a professional theatrical production.

Beck received the 2016 Best Set Design (Professional) award from the online magazine BroadwayWorld.com Orlando for his work on TheatreWorks Florida's production of the musical *Rock of Ages*. He won the same award in 2014 for his set design in TheatreWorks Florida's production of *Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street*.

Beck joined the faculty in 1996 and regularly directs productions for the FSC Department of Theatre Arts, which was ranked No. 19 in the Best College Theater list by the Princeton Review's 2018 edition of *The Best 382 Colleges*. He said designing a set is part of the process of telling the story of the play.

"I read the play to understand the concept and see what kind of inspiration I get from the story. Then there is a lot of visual research about the time period and what kind of world is being represented. Finally I'll draw a sketch and present it to the director," he said.

Beck's design for *Rock of Ages* presented the interior of a Los Angeles music club during the 1980s. He did some research and found that many of those clubs were "very eclectic," often without a single theme but decorated with an assortment of posters and objects.

"I did something I haven't done before. I broke up the walls so they were not all on one plane but had parts of it recessed and other parts at different heights, with a lot of texture at the top. I wasn't sure it was going to work, but it was nice to look at when it was finished," he said.





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
