LIFE-CHANGING BOATLIFT FROM CUBA TO U.S. REEXAMINED BY DR. JOSÉ MANUEL GARCÍA

On both a personal and professional level, Dr. José Manuel García recently revisited the dramatic 1980 Mariel Boatlift from Cuba to the United States, one of the largest mass migration events in Latin American history. Dr. García was a teenager when he and his family made the harrowing 90-mile journey across the Florida Strait in a leaky boat brought to Cuba by a relative from Key West.


His book *Voices from Mariel: Oral Histories of the 1980 Cuban Boatlift*, published in hardcover by University Press of Florida in 2018, recounts the experiences of García's own family, as well as other stories from among the 125,000 Cuban refugees (known as Marielitos) who fled their homeland during the six-month exodus.

"Before the 1959 revolution, the Cuban economy was larger than the Italian economy," said Dr. García, associate professor of Spanish and Latin American Studies at Florida Southern. "Now, Cuba is one of the poorest countries in the world."

In response to growing unrest in the island nation, Cuba's president, Fidel Castro, had decided to allow those who wanted to leave to do so. Dr. García's book, told in the words of the Marielitos themselves, is a companion to an award-winning 2011 documentary of the same name which chronicled his return to Cuba after 30 years, and for which he wrote the script.

Despite the scope and scale of the Cuban exodus, "there isn't a whole lot written about the Mariel Boatlift," Dr. García said. He views both the book and the documentary as important teaching tools, having renewed international interest in the event and its effects. Dr. García has given talks in the U.S. and at such far-flung locations as Australian National University in Canberra, where he was awarded a visiting fellowship, and at Macquarie University in Sydney, where he was invited to speak at their Global Leadership Program Foreign Series.

His work also was the subject of an April 2018 article in *Perspectives on History*, newsmagazine of the American Historical Association.

RESEARCH ON SMALL-SCALE SUBJECTS HOLDS PROMISE OF BIG DISCOVERIES

Dr. Gabriel Langford, associate professor of Biology and George W. Truitt Endowed Chair in the Sciences, brought his academic interests in parasitology, herpetology, and environmental studies to the Florida Southern campus in 2010. Today, he and his students are involved in studies linking all three research areas. While many of the students in Langford's labs work on parasitic organisms and their hosts, several others focus on the study of amphibians and reptiles. Both fields encompass the students' environmental concerns.

For example, when student Justin Mukhalian wanted to find out whether beetle larvae could break down pollutants such as Styrofoam and plastic, he and Dr. Langford collaborated with FSC microbiologist Dr. Melanie Langford to find an answer. The larvae, it turns out, have a gut bacteria that helps them digest Styrofoam. Could follow-up studies show similar promise with plastics such as grocery bags? Might there be an industrial application? "We are currently working with Justin to publish our results," Gabriel Langford said. "It is always fun to see such passion in a student."

The word "passion" may not spring to mind when the topic is gut bacteria, Langford realizes. Among those who are scientifically minded, however, exhilarating moments on the road to discovery can relate to even the most unassuming creatures and their smaller-than-small inner secrets. That rings true for student Kylie DeBoer, whose work with Langford on her honors thesis involves tiny burrowing nematodes that infect land snails throughout central Florida.

"She has dissected more than 1,000 snails from Orlando to St. Petersburg," Langford said. "Most of the infected snails were found on golf courses, for some reason, and on non-native plants. Maybe the snails are brought in on those plants."

Langford also mentored former student Leyna Stemle, whose study of the spatial ecology of mud turtles led to a Fulbright Study/Research Award. Langford oversaw Stemle's Fulbright application and research proposal, which took her to Ghana to test whether adding lights to the mouths of fishermen's trawl nets could reduce accidental catches of leatherback sea turtles.

Currently president-elect of the Southeastern Society of Parasitologists, Langford earned his Ph.D. in parasitology at the University of Nebraska, his M.S. in herpetology at the University of South Alabama, and his B.G.S. in environmental studies at the University of Kansas.
